## INTRODUCTION

This is the last week of our series "Jesus, Justice, And..." This week, we will be coming to God and to his Word to hear what Jesus has to say about race. Jesus has good news to speak to us this week, even in the hardest of topics. Jesus comes bringing unity where there was division and healing where there was pain, both thousands of years ago and today.

## **TRUTH**

#### **READ**

John 4:1-45

#### **DISCUSS**

- What do you think Jesus is talking about when he says "whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again"? (vv. 14).
- What strikes you about Jesus' attitude toward the Samaritan woman? Compare his behavior to that of the disciples and that of the nearby town.

# GRACE

#### **DISCUSS**

Both in ancient Samaria and today,
Jesus responds to division by
bringing the unity of his spirit and the
love of his family. Have you, like the
Samaritan woman, ever felt on the
outside of a racial or social division?
Have you ever been afraid to step
over a social or racial division? What
would Jesus say to that situation? How
does seeing Jesus' grace toward the
Samaritan woman (and toward you!)
change how you think about that
situation?

# **CHANGE**

#### **DISCUSS**

"Jesus said to her, "Go." (vv. 16). Jesus' mission is too important to be stopped by racial or social barriers. He calls us to reach out to those different from us-and to receive grace from those different from us! What would it look like for you to bring Jesus to those who look different from you? How could you be more open to the grace that Jesus has for you in the mouths and hearts of your brothers and sisters that look different from you? If you had Jesus' heart and compassion for the hurting and excluded, how would you be emboldened to cross these barriers?

# **PRAYER**

Praise the Father that he created our diversity to be a blessing and an image of Him. Praise Jesus that he has broken down our divisions in the unity of his body. Praise the Spirit, who has been poured out on us through the hands and mouths of those different from ourselves. Ask God to heal you of trauma, of fear, of hardheartedness; ask Him to bring you on His mission to every nation, tribe, and tongue.

# DISCIPLESHIP CHECK-IN

- Have you read your Bible and prayed consistently the past week?
- Who is one lost person you're praying would come to faith?
