# INTRODUCTION

What does it mean to have crazy faith? Luckily, the Bible is full of examples of humans putting their trust in God and watching him do incredible things.

# REFLECT & APPLY

## DISCUSS

- Read Hebrews 12:2. The chapter before this verse is about these great people of faith we find in Scripture. All of the heroes of the Bible find their faith founded and perfected in Jesus. He is the one for whom their faith was longing. How does knowing that Jesus is the founder and perfecter of your faith encourage you?
- In the garden of Gethsemane, Jesus is being emotionally honest before the Lord by sharing his desires, but he remains willing to submit to the Father because he trusts him. How can you shape your own prayer life to look more like Jesus'?

# PRAYER

Praise Jesus who is the founder and perfecter of our faith. Pray that the Spirit would strengthen our faith and help us to model more of our prayer life after Jesus'.
