INTRODUCTION

DISCUSS

REFLECT & APPLY

DISCUSS

- In the following chapter of Genesis, Adam and Eve will disobey God by eating from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil and because of their rebellion sin and brokenness will enter into the world. How has sin affected your family or how you interact with your family?
- All of our families have felt the effects of sin. The good news is Jesus came not only to forgive the sins committed against one another, but also to empower families to experience and share the healing power of the gospel together. How

do you think your family can run after Jesus together?

PRAYER

Praise the Father who sent his son to invite us into the only perfect family. Pray that Jesus would be who your family runs after in all circumstances.
