CONNECT BREAK THE ICE AND GET PEOPLE TALKING

- When you imagine success, what do you imagine?

- Discipleship check-in

INTRODUCTION

As we prepare for Christmas and go through the Advent season, we are going to be reading the various songs that people sing in response to the announcement of Christ's birth. Our hope is that these songs will guide us into worship as well. Take time as a group this week to read Mary's song, her response to an angel's announcement that she will be the mother of our Lord.

READ & DISCUSS

<u>READ:</u> Luke 1:46-49

<u>DISCUSS</u>: Mary's reasons for praising God begin with "For he has looked on the humble estate of his servant." Why is that so important to her?

<u>READ:</u> Luke 1:50-53

<u>DISCUSS:</u> "He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty." Why is this a cause of rejoicing for Mary?

<u>READ:</u> Luke 1:54-55

DISCUSS: Do you see God's hand in your family history? How so?

REFLECT & APPLY

DISCUSS: How can you learn to respond to God the way Mary did?

PRAY

Pray Mary's prayer together, thanking God for what he accomplished not only in Jesus' birth, but also in his death and resurrection. Take time to meditate on how each line of this poem is even more meaningful and applicable to us, who live on the other side of Christ's victory over sin and the grave.
