RECAP

MAIN THEMES

Big Idea: Even the summits under the sun can't be the source of the meaning we crave.

Christ-Connect: Jesus didn't receive gain from sinners; rather he took loss for sinners.

Application: We must make Jesus our true gain, then we can enjoy life under the sun.

Ecclesiastes 2:1-11

DISCUSS

The Teacher scaled the heights of pleasure and human achievement, but it wasn't the true gain he was looking for. In your own thinking, what metaphorical mountain are you most drawn to as a source of meaning?

READ

Ecclesiastes 2:24-26

DISCUSS

Nothing under the sun can be our source of meaning. Only God can. The beautiful thing about making God your source of meaning is that you are then able to enjoy life's simple pleasures. How do you see this impacting the way you order your own life?

READ & DISCUSS

READ

Philippians 3:7-11

DISCUSS

For Paul, nothing compares to knowing Jesus. In Christ, he found his true gain. What is it about Jesus that makes knowing him true gain? In what ways have you experienced this in your own life?

PRAYER

Read Philippians 3:7–11 again slowly. Spend time glorifying Jesus for the true treasure he is.

DISCIPLESHIP CHECK-IN

- Have you read your Bible consistently the past week?
- Who is someone you're praying to share Jesus with?
