## CONNECT

- As a student (of any age) what's one project you worked on that you were really proud of?
- What's something valuable you've lost? It can be valuable in terms of cost or sentiment.
- What's an insight from the book of Daniel you've found really compelling and helpful?

## RECAP

Here's an overview of the main ideas from the sermon.

#### **MAIN THEMES**

**Big Idea:** God must make a stump of our pride in order to make us fruitful in exile.

Christ-Connect: Jesus was driven from among men and became unrecognizable, not because of pride like Nebuchadnezzar, but in order to clothe sinners in glory.

**Application:** We must stop playing the self-glory game and receive the glory God has given us through Jesus.

## READ & DISCUSS

#### **READ**

Daniel 4:1-3,24-27

#### **DISCUSS**

Like a tree that gets chopped down to a stump, God promised to humble Nebuchadnezzar. The Babylonian king's pride was a danger to himself and those around him, and it had to go. In what ways have you seen pride be dangerous?

## READ & DISCUSS

#### **READ**

Daniel 4:28-33

#### **DISCUSS**

When the king looks out over the city of Babylon, he believes it says something about how glorious and majestic he is. This is how the self-glory game works – you find something to point at to make you feel significant and important. It's easy to see the self-glory game at work Nebuchadnezzar's life, but what accomplishments, identifiers, or experiences do you tend to point at to feel significant and important?

## READ & DISCUSS

#### **READ**

Daniel 4:34-26

#### **DISCUSS**

God always humbles in order to exalt. Nebuchadnezzar returned to Babylon as a humble, worshipful man. Do you have a hard time believing that God's humbling is intended to exalt you? Why or why not?

## **PRAYER**

Read Isaiah 52:13–15. Spend time meditating on Jesus's humiliating death on the cross. Praise him for the glory he has given us by his grace. Ask God for a posture of humble worship, and that it would make you fruitful in exile.
