INTRODUCTION

This week we're starting our new series *Image and Identity*, and we couldn't be more excited! Over the next few weeks, we'll be delving into what it means to be human. This week, we are starting with the foundation: we are made in the image of God. That means that *becoming who we are doesn't start with us; it starts with God.*

Genesis 1:26-28

DISCUSS

What can we learn about humans from this passage?

READ

Genesis 5:1-3

DISCUSS

What does the word "image" mean here? What does that say about God's relationship to us?

READ & DISCUSS

READ

Exodus 20:3-4

DISCUSS

God's people are forbidden from carving "images," or idols. Idols were statues that people thought contained the spirit of a god. What does that suggest about what God means to do when he creates humans as "images"?

REFLECT & APPLY

DISCUSS

God made us as human imagers, as people who would show what God is like. We're like children who are growing into the likeness of our father. God wants us to become more and more like Him so that everyone else can see what He is like. That makes us like what people used to think idols were for—we're images of God, filled with His Spirit. And people can come to us to meet God and be blessed by Him. (That means that making idols doesn't just misunderstand who God is! It misunderstands who we are as well).

REFLECT & APPLY

DISCUSS (CONTINUED)

If that's the destiny we're made for, we need God to show us what it means to be His imagers. We need to know God well if we're going to show what He's like to everyone else. And that requires humility! We have to humble ourselves and ask God what it means for us to become who we were always meant to be.

Is there a place in your life where you haven't made imaging God your goal? What would it look like to invite God to come into that part of your life and transform it to tell the truth about who He is?

PRAY

As we seek to be made into God's imagers, we're seeking to be made into the image of Christ. Jesus was the first human who truly was what we were all called to be: an obedient child and perfect image of his Father. Because of that, he's been given the inheritance we were all meant to have (and are offered still!): to rule along with God forever and ever.

So let's pray this week that the Spirit of God would enter us, individually and as a community, and make us like Jesus. Thank God for the gift of His Spirit, and ask that His Spirit would be poured out on us more and more, and that we would be more and more obedient to it.
