HOW TO USE THIS GROUP GUIDE

CONNECT (10 MINS)

- Pick one or more of the warm-up questions and have all the group members give a response to the question(s).
- Make sure everybody gets a chance to speak. Don't let talkative people dominate the conversation, but graciously welcome everybody to participate.

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TRUTH (15-20 MIN)

- Read the scriptures and paragraphs in this section to clearly communicate what the Bible says about the week's topic.
- "DISCUSS" sections: These sections get people discussing the practical implications of the truth being discussed. Have one or two people give an answer, but don't spend too much time on these questions.

GRACE (5 MINS)

- Read the grace scripture and section which shows how the passage points to Jesus Christ and God's grace.
- This section is really important, because it shows that life change begins with the grace of God and not our own efforts.

CHANGE (10-15 MINS)

- Have everyone give an answer to each of the change questions.
- Take a good amount of time here. Really encourage people to think through how they can practically put truth into action.

PRAYER (10-15 MINS)

- Read through the prayer focus points and have one or two people in the group pray.
- Make sure not to rush through prayer. The things we want God to change in our lives will often happen through prayer.

DISCIPLESHIP CHECK-IN (2 MINS)

 This final portion aims to get people reading the Bible for themselves and thinking about engaging others with the gospel.



CONNECT

BREAK THE ICE AND
GET PEOPLE TALKING

- What were some of your favorite moments over the holiday season?
- What's one thing you plan on changing in your life this year?
- When you hear the words "The Holy Spirit," what associations come to mind?

TRUTH

UNDERSTAND AND DISCUSS
THE SCRIPTURE'S MEANING

We're jumping back into Romans – this beautiful exploration of the gospel, the good news about Jesus Christ. In chapter 8, Paul is going to describe how the Holy Spirit changes the life of someone who believes the gospel. Depending on your background, the Holy Spirit might come along with some weird associations. But we can't let that keep us from seeing the fact that the Spirit is absolutely essential to a life shaped by the gospel. In fact, it's only through the Spirit that a life shaped by the gospel is even possible.

A New Desire

READ: Romans 8:1-8

DISCUSS: What's one thing you see in these verses that the Holy Spirit brings about in the life of a disciple?

When Paul talks about two different laws – the law of the Spirit of life and the law of sin and death – he's talking about a principle at work, not just a set of rules. Those who are in Christ operate according to a different principle. What's that driving principle? A love for God, which is what he means by saying that the "righteous requirement of the law" is fulfilled in us. Those who love God desire to please him. Those who don't love God mistrust him. Those who love God are preoccupied with things that bring him joy. Those who don't love God

are preoccupied with gratifying their flesh. The difference is a love for God given to us by the Spirit.

A New Reality

READ: Romans 8:9-11

DISCUSS: What do you think we should do in light of these verses?

That was trick question. Sorry. The funny thing about Romans 8 is that there aren't any imperatives in the whole thing; we're never told to do anything. Paul is simply describing what is reality for a Spirit-led believer. Notice all the if/then statements in the passage. A believer, empowered by the Spirit, simply is no longer dominated by the flesh and is fully capable of enjoying the new life the Spirit. The new life of the Spirit isn't something you can work yourself into getting without him.

A New Victory

READ: Romans 8:12-17

DISCUSS: What stands out to you from these verses and why?

The message that you should deny desires that don't please God is offensive in our day and age. Yet that's exactly what people living in the new way of the Spirit do. The flesh will try pressure you into "deeds" that displease God, like a yapping dog demanding food. But those in Christ don't owe that dog anything. This doesn't mean that your flesh offers pleasure and the Spirit offers displeasure. Quite the opposite! The Spirit empowers you to fulfill desires in a way that pleases God and that produces life and peace in your own life.

GRACE

SEE HOW THE PASSAGE CONNECTS TO JESUS

The flesh barks out, "God's holding out on you!" The Spirit says to your soul, "You are God's child." A God who adopted us at the cost of his own Son has given us the Holy Spirit that we might know whose we truly are. And if we are his then we are heirs of his promises. The yapping dog of the flesh has nothing to offer.

CHANGE

APPLY THE PASSAGE TO OUR THOUGHTS, FEELINGS, AND ACTIONS

- How does this description of life in the Spirit change the way you see your own life?
- What "deeds of the body" is the Spirit calling you to put to death in your life right now?
- What kind of impact does it have on you to know that God calls you a fellow heir with Christ of his promises?

PRAYER

RESPOND TO THE PASSAGE IN PRAYER

- Pray for anyone struggling to believe that they're loved by God.
- Pray for the empowering of the Holy Spirit in your life this week.

Discipleship Check-In

- Have you read your Bible consistently the past week?
- Who is someone you're engaging with the gospel?
